TUESDAY 13th JUNE - GRAHAM KEAL - "OPRAH WINFREY TOUCHED MY ELBOW"

Ex-showbiz journalist Graham Keal has been interviewing TV celebrities for over 30 years, Oprah included. His interviews and columns have been published everywhere from The Daily Telegraph to My Weekly, from TV Times to The Sun, from The Guardian to The Daily Record. Graham has also entertained in folk clubs, compared concerts, and auditioned for Opportunity Knocks. Now he combines his professional insight with his incisive wit to amuse Rotary Charter Nights, social clubs, U3As, WIs, ladies' luncheon clubs etc. Why was Sir David Attenborough making eyes at him? 
TUESDAY 11th JULY - REV CANON ALAN HAYDOCK - "CONFESSIONS OF A COUNTRY VICAR"

Alan was born in Wigan and educated at the King's School, Ely. He trained at Kelham Theological College and, since his ordination in Southwell Minster in 1965, has served the whole of his ministry in Nottinghamshire. He became Canon of Southwell Minster in 1986.

A keen sportsman, Alan follows both Nottingham Football Clubs and is a former member of Nottinghamshire Cricket Club's General committee.

Over the past 12 years Alan has donated over £100,000 to various churches, charities and sporting organisations by means of his speaking fees. His charm, warm-heartedness, funny stories and quick wit make him a sought-after entertainer for a range of events. His true to life stories are infectious and highly entertaining. Being a keen sports fan, Canon Alan Haydock is able to mix banter from two religions – that of the church and that of the football terraces.

WINE TASTING

The wine tasting group has 36 members, 75% of whom are very regular attendees at its meetings on the 4th Thursday of the month in St Helen's Church Centre. Typically, each meeting is hosted by two couples, who are responsible for deciding the theme for the evening, buying the wines, providing nibbles (bread, cheese, olives, etc), and devising a wine-themed quiz. All costs are reimbursed from the charge of £10pp made on the night.



The group tastes 8 wines, 4 white and 4 red, and unfortunately, since a bottle contains 750ml, we often have to restrict the number of attendees to 22 to ensure everyone has a reasonable taste.

The group coordinator sends an email to all the group's members on the 1st day of the month providing details of that month's events, and attendance is allocated on a first come, first served basis. If, as is often the case, more than 22 people want to come along, those who respond later are added to a reserve list and contacted if there are any cancellations. They are also given first refusal the following month.

Over the past 12 months themes have included Italian, Bordeaux, French, Spanish Australian and New Zealand wines, together with two summer evening al fresco social evenings (one a barbecue), a "Christmassy" theme at the December meeting, "An Unusual Wine Evening", and "Around the World in 8 Wines". May's theme is "Burgundy".

Visit to The Centre of Evidence Based Dermatology

Possibly hoping for the secret to wrinkle free faces, approximately 30 of us visited this department at the University of Nottingham. Here we heard 3 experts as well as Caroline's sister-in-law who pretended not to be but actually was, very informative. We were told of the 1,000 or so different skin conditions that drive the research, before delving into details of the effect of the Menopause on the skin. Interestingly, exercise of both mind and body are shown to be beneficial proving the benefits of u3a membership! This was followed by a talk on the effects of drugs and vaccines on the skin by an Assistant Professor of Medical Statistics – the next study is looking at the effects of the Covid 19 vaccine. Finally their exciting news was that they have just been given funding to offer an Eczema sup-



port group. Eczema affects 20% of children and 10% of adults, so if you, or anyone in your family suffer, they would love to hear from you at




Group News Political History


RIVER TRENT CRUISE SUNDAY 20TH AUGUST
